Letter from Logix Community Stars Foundation



Logix employees set a new bar for generosity in 2022, by giving a record-breaking **\$157,000** to the Community Stars Foundation. We triumphantly worked together to show our community that we care. Through payroll deductions, fundraisers, including two pin campaigns and the most successful toy drive to date, Community Stars raised more than **\$226,000** for our nonprofit partners to make a difference in countless lives.

In 2022, the foundation welcomed two new charities to our lineup: Senior Concerns and Carousel Ranch. With our help, Senior Concerns was able to continue providing service, support and advocacy to seniors in the Conejo Valley. Carousel Ranch put the Foundation dollars to good use, upgrading a brand new tool shed and allowing Logix to adopt a horse, Norah (pictured here).

Our legacy nonprofits, Burbank Temporary Aid Center, For The Troops and Penny Lane Centers, have continued to climb back from the challenges brought on by the pandemic. BTAC helped welcome Logix into its new location in Downtown Burbank and received support via a food drive during our grand opening. For The Troops mailed its 275,000th care package to troops serving overseas. Penny Lane Centers received **\$5,110** in cash donations – plus a sleigh-full of toys and gift cards – for our Charlie Brown-themed Toy Drive.

Our fundraising efforts have brought us to a grand total of **\$1.99 million** raised for nonprofits since the launch of Community Stars in 2007. This achievement means we're looking forward to hitting a major milestone in 2023: Reaching our goal of **\$2 million!** Cresting this mark is a demonstration of our commitment to giving back and making a difference in our community. Thanks to everyone who has participated in our efforts – employees and members alike – we're able to make a real impact. Thank you for partnering with us. We look forward to an even more successful 2023!

Since its founding in 2005, the all-volunteer nonprofit has sent more than 275,000 Priority Mail boxes from its donated storefront in Simi Valley. Each box contains personal care items, snacks and sweets, socks and other items that give each service member a taste of home comfort. The dollars donated by Logix Community Stars goes directly toward paying the postage for the care packages.

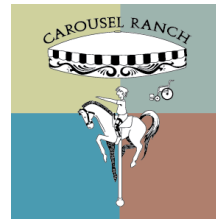
Since 1969, Penny Lane Centers has worked to transform the lives of individuals and families who have been left marginalized, unhoused or underserved by their communities. Through adoption services, foster care, domestic violence protection and mental health care, the nonprofit helps children build new lives and empower them to reach their hopes and dreams. Penny Lane also operates transitional housing, providing a safety net for youth growing out of the foster care system.

Senior Concerns provides high-quality support services to seniors, their families and caregivers throughout the Conejo Valley. The organization gives seniors a sense of belonging through a robust Adult Day Center that combines physical movement, social connectedness and mental stimulation. A Meals on Wheels program delivers freshly prepared food to homebound seniors 365 days a year. Senior Concerns also offers legal and advocacy services, caregiver support and education, and in-home assessments for seniors with cognitive or physical impairments.

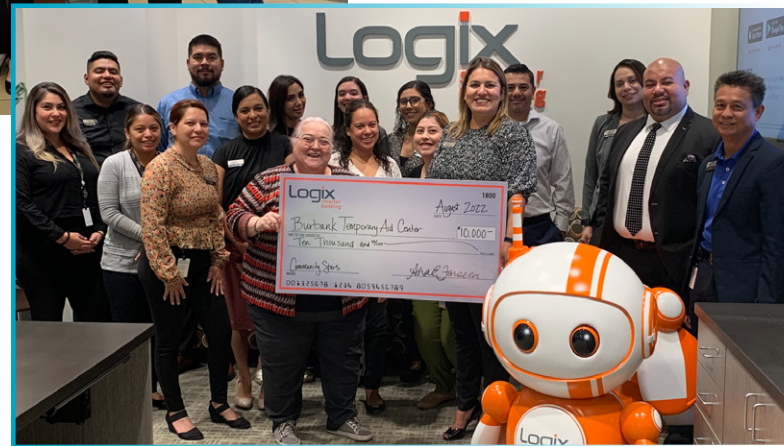

The nonprofit uses equestrian therapy to both challenge young riders and give them a sense of independence and freedom that defies their disability. Young adults with special needs can prepare for life beyond high school through the ranch's Ready to Work! program, which offers vocational training and real work experience.

Toy Drive

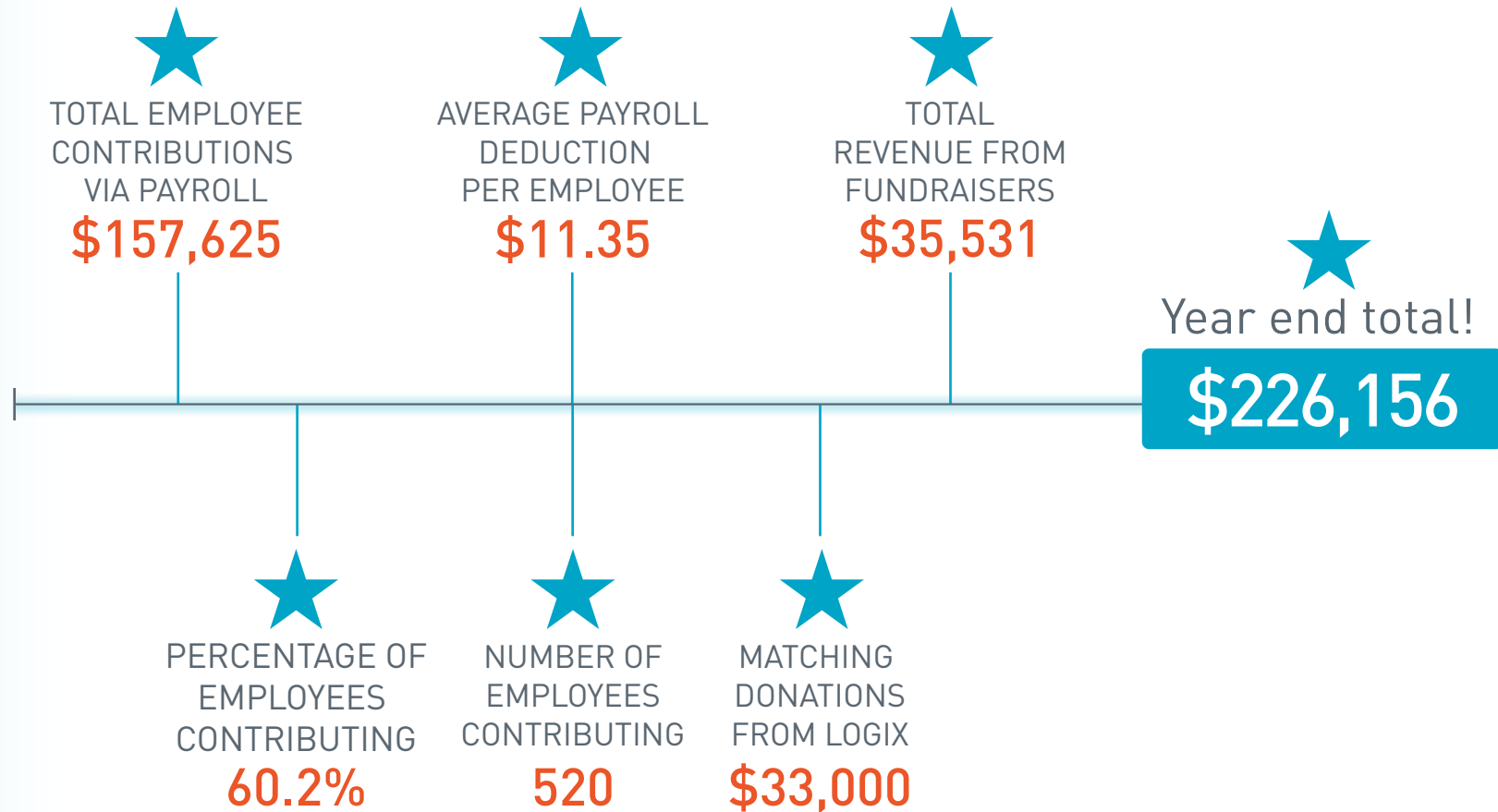
